| Day 3 Meal Inclusions: <i>Breakfast</i> <i>Lunch</i> | NAPLES Breakfast at Hotel <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Olive Oil Factory- Visit a farm producing extra virgin olive oil using traditional production techniques. The olive tree is an ancient plant, its history and that of man are linked by more than 7,000 years. The tour starts with a visit of the olive grove. The group will then visit the mill dating from 1849 to understand the traditional technique of processing the olives. There is then a visit to the modern mill and finally a tasting of olive oil and typical products. Gnocchi Making Class - Students will learn will how to make these popular small potato dumplings from scratch at a local cookery school. Get hands – on preparing, rolling and cutting the dough to create this popular Italian specialty. Different sauces will accompany the dish and everyone gets to sample the finished product. The island is famed for its lemon groves, natural beauty and expensive boutiques. Highlights include the Villa San Michelle and the cable car ride to the summit of the island. <i>Overnight Naples</i> |
| Day 5 Meal Inclusions: <i>Breakfast</i> <i>Dinner</i> | NAPLES -- ROME Breakfast at Hotel before coach transfer to Rome <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Limoncello Factory - The production of 'limoncello' lemon liqueur dates back to ancient times on the Sorrentine Peninsular. The traditional methods of manufacture are handed down from generation to generation. This after dinner 'digestif' gets its unique flavour from the lemons of the region which are oval, medium to large, with pale yellow very juicy flesh. The skins have a special fragrance due to the concentration of the essential oils present. The liqueur is well known and exported around the world. Arrive at Hotel for check in/ drop bags Pizza Making Class – Students can get hands on making Neapolitan Pizza. After creating their own pizzas students will enjoy a pizza dinner. <i>Overnight Rome</i> |

Along the way, your guide will entertain and educate you with stories and insights into Rome's culture and history, while exploring the city's most fascinating offbeat landmarks. <p><i>Overnight Rome</i></p> |
| <p>Day 7</p> <p>Meal Inclusions: <i>Breakfast</i></p> | <p>ROME Breakfast at Hotel</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vatican City- The centre of the Roman Catholic Church is home to the awe-inspiring Renaissance masterpiece Basilica di San Pietro and the Vatican Museums, with rich collections from classical sculpture to Egyptian pieces, Renaissance paintings and the legendary Sistine Chapel. Students learn how the Vatican gained its position and explore its contemporary meaning. • Food Market - Check out one of the city's oldest food markets, where pasta-making and other traditional culinary crafts are regularly on display. Chat to local stall holders and sample seasonal produce. • Trevi Fountain - This fountain at the junction of three roads – tre vie – marks the end point of one of the aqueducts that supplied water to ancient Rome. <p><i>Overnight Rome</i></p> |

Tonight they can be a part of a French Cinema night and enjoy some free time swimming or playing sports in the recreational areas. • Traditional French Cuisine: Students can participate in a crepe and apple cider night run by the Chateau Chef. <p><i>Overnight Chateau Du Molay</i></p> |
| <p>Day 9</p> <p>Meal Inclusions: <i>Breakfast Lunch Dinner</i></p> | <p>CHATEAU DU MOLAY (Normandy) Breakfast at Chateau and pick up packed lunch</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Boulangerie Visit- A trip to a traditional French bakery lets pupils learn about the complete process of bread making. Students can actively participate and eat in or take away what they help to create. This tour is worthwhile just for the smell alone, but there are also great opportunities to ask the baker some questions. • Oyster beds- On a visit to the oyster beds in Normandy, students can try what may be their first taste of oyster and observe farming and fishing techniques along the coast. The trip is a chance to compare and contrast the industries of the land against those of the sea, and educate the palate. • Cookery Demonstration- Students enjoy a demonstration of the preparation of local specialties given by a French chef. This can take place in French or English and some participation is encouraged. This is a great way to engage with the language, culture and local food. <p><i>Overnight Chateau Du Molay</i></p> |

| <p>Day 10</p> <p>Meal Inclusions: Breakfast Lunch Dinner</p> | <p>CHATEAU DU MOLAY (Normandy)</p> <p>Breakfast at Chateau and pick up packed lunch</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Omaha Beach, US Cemetery: The Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial covers 172.5 acres and contains the graves of 9,387 military dead, most of whom lost their lives in the D-Day landings and ensuing operations. The memorial, set around a bronze statue, shows maps and narratives of the military operations. Centre staff are available to answer students' questions. • Chèvrerie du Mesnil (Goats' cheese farm): This is a hands-on goat farm that allows students to see how dairy products such as milk and cheese are produced. Students can play with the goats and take part in the milking process. It's a great way to find out more about the traditional produce of the area and also presents a good chance to practice language skills and develop vocabulary. • Chocolaterie Les Marianik's- This quality artisan chocolaterie close to Deauville allows students an insider view into how chocolate is made and why it tastes so delicious. A master chocolatier gives a historical and geographical account of the chocolate making process. There is a demonstration of chocolate being moulded and chocolate covered specialties. • Traditional French Cuisine: On the list of things to do in France, trying frogs' legs and snails is near the top. After a long day the students and staff can opt for traditional frogs' legs and snails as an accompaniment to an evening meal. This allows the adventurous students a chance to taste a traditional French delicacy. <p><i>Overnight Chateau Du Molay</i></p> |
| <p>Day 11</p> <p>Meal Inclusions: Breakfast Lunch</p> | <p>CHATEAU DU MOLAY -- PARIS</p> <p>Breakfast at Chateau before coach transfer to Paris</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Eiffel Tower (not included in tour price, to be paid on arrival): This huge iron monument is named after its architect Gustave Eiffel and has become an icon of France and one of the most recognizable structures in the world. This is a 'must do' for first time visitors to Paris. • Transfer to Hotel for check in/ drop bags • Louvre Museum: The Louvre, originally a palace but now one of the largest and most visited museums in the world, is a must-visit for anyone with a slight interest in art. There are 35,000 paintings, sculptures and relics displayed over 60,000 square meters of exhibition space. The Louvre holds some of the world's most famous works of art, such as the Mona Lisa, The Virgin and Child and the Venus de Milo. • Notre Dame: Gargoyles and wild sculptures by Violet Le Duc decorate this famous old cathedral that sits alongside the River Seine. The Cathedral is still open to worshippers and serves as a fine example of French Gothic architecture. • Arc de Triomphe: This spectacular monument stands at the western edge of the Champs-Élysées and was originally built as a celebration of Napoleonic success. It is now regarded as a monument to remember the dead and contains the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. • Champs Elysees: The Avenue des Champs-Élysées is a prestigious avenue in Paris, France. With its cinemas, cafés, luxury specialty shops and clipped horse-chestnut trees, the Avenue des Champs-Élysées is one of the most famous streets in the world. <p><i>Overnight Paris</i></p> |
